# **Community Shelter Meals**

- Cook or bake at home and bring your dish to Cornerstones' Embry Rucker Shelter, where we provide dinner for about 75 shelter residents.
- Help to serve the dinner at the shelter.

## **Home Cooking for Hypothermia Shelter**

- Help provide dinner for 35 to 40 guests at Cornerstones' Hypothermia Shelter roughly every two weeks from December through March.
- Donate food for others to prepare, or cook or bake at home and deliver to the shelter.

# MENTORING FOREST EDGE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL CHILDREN (team lead, Jim Rose)

- Meet weekly with a student for 30 minutes (meeting times and dates are at the mentor's discretion as approved by the school counselor). Program operated as MentorWorks across FCPS.
- Activities consist of board games, reading, homework or classroom support, or other activities. High need for Spanish speaking adults.

# **WELCOMING THE STRANGER: Afghan and Ukrainian Family Resettlement** (team co-leads, Kathy & Ken Laskey (Afghan) and Ellyn & Dave Pontell (Ukrainian))

# Counting the *Change*: Our Work by the Numbers

- \$50,000 in cash and gift cards donated this year by our generous community to support our Tikkun Olam work and donations on behalf of NVHC.
- 5,000 pounds of food donated annually at our High Holy Day food drive for Cornerstones.
- 12 shelter meals prepared and served annually by friendly NVHC volunteers to 75 residents in the community shelter and 30 in the hypothermia shelter.
- 3068 packets of oatmeal, 1320 packages of popcorn, 1152 granola bars, 504 apple sauce pouches and 96 ramen containers donated in a single month for elementary school snack bags, with similar amounts each month during the school year (paid for with \$10,000 in Tikkun Olam funds).
- With those supplies, 500 weekend snack bags packed each school week by HHK volunteers for 8 neighborhood elementary school children, with occasional assistance from our religious school students and NVHC volunteers.
- 850 Nonpartisan Get Out the Vote postcards written and mailed, and untold hours spent registering voters, working at polling places, and participating in nonpartisan advocacy.
- Hundreds of NVHC volunteer hours provided one-on-one relationships and mentoring to Forest Edge students.
- Incalculable benefits to our Afghan extended family of 11 and our Ukrainian immigrant families of 8, supported with generous personal assistance, financial contributions, household good donations, gift cards, 4 used cars, and countless hours of English lessons and other volunteer work.
- Improvements identified to reduce NVHC's carbon footprint, as well as sustainable solutions for congregants' homes and businesses.
- 14 dozen rainbow brownies and cookies handed out by NVHC volunteers welcoming participants at the annual Reston Pride festival at Lake Anne.
- Time, talent, energy and initiative by dedicated NVHC volunteers to:
